Objectives & Expected results	<p>Del. 2.2.1 3rd UNIWORK Training Module: <i>ENTERPRISE AND ENTREPRENEURSHIP SUPPORT BY CAREER CENTRES</i></p> <p>This module will focus on enterprise and entrepreneurship education. Participants will learn how each of these areas is defined, and we will consider:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Why each is offered; • What it adds to students' experience of higher education and how it develops their skills; and • How it can be delivered effectively, including considering staffing and resource requirements. <p>We will look at enterprise education both within university curricula and as extra-curricular activity, and consider how students' ideas for business startup can be nurtured and supported. There will be an emphasis on practical ideas for each topic, with case studies of activities offered in Sheffield and the other EU partners. Participants will have the opportunity to consider how they might adapt these ideas to run them in their own institutions and with their own students, and will leave the workshop with ideas that could be implemented as part of UNIWORK Work Package 5, which will be launched during this training module.</p>
